1 Share idea/opportunity with NCCOR

- a. Present on a monthly call, at a Member Meeting, to the Steering Committee, or to the Coordinating Center



2 Interest among NCCOR partners

- a. 2+ partner organizations agree



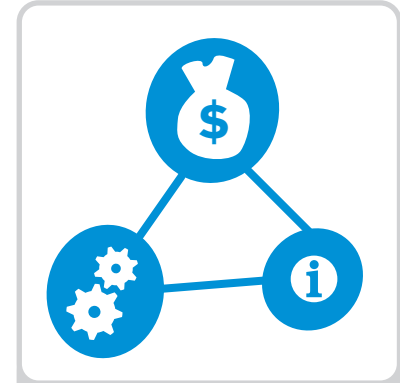
3 Complete Proposed Project Form

- a. Goal(s), lead and workgroup members, budget, timeline, communication products, evaluation
- b. Reviewed by Steering Committee representative before sharing with the full Steering Committee



4 Steering Committee reviews project for fit

- a. Is proposal consistent with NCCOR mission and goals?
- b. Does proposal address a critical research gap?
- c. Is there a clear benefit to identifying the project as an NCCOR project?
- d. Steering Committee provides feedback



5 Determine funding resource(s) & mechanism(s)

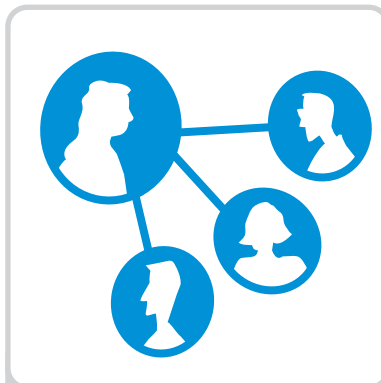
- a. Funding from an NCCOR partner(s)
- b. Funding from the Coordinating Center
- c. Funding from a strategic alliance partner

*After funding opportunities have been examined, the Steering Committee will revisit project proposal and next steps.



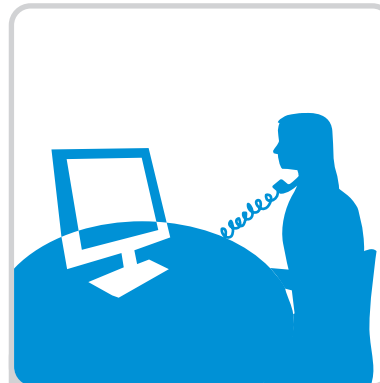
6 Designate a lead person and set up a workgroup

- a. Workgroup has representation across NCCOR funders (as appropriate)
- b. Identify external scientific experts, if needed

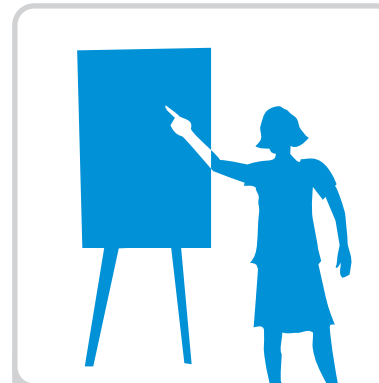


7 Identify Coordinating Center support team
