WHAT DOES NCCOR DO?

NCCOR offers opportunities for sustained collaboration among partner agencies working to improve childhood obesity research and surveillance. NCCOR helps members:

NOW DOES THE NCCOR COORDINATING CENTER UPPORT MEMBERS?

NCCOR Coordinating Center offers management, communication, and scientific support to help members their NCCOR-related projects. HOW CAN I BE INVOLVED?

MEMBER MEETINGS

In-person, day-long interactive learning and planning sessions that occur three times a year. Expert speakers present emerging childhood obesity research and members discuss how NCCOR can contribute to new research areas.



MEMBER CALLS

One-hour videoconferences that feature NCCOR members and other expert speakers discussing current research, policies, and programs related to childhood obesity. Occurs monthly, except for months when a member meeting is scheduled.



WORKGROUP MEETINGS

Virtual with occasional in-person workshops to advance a collaborative project. Workgroup members choose how often and when to meet at the beginning of their project.



HOW DOES NCCOR DISSEMINATE INFORMATION?

NCCOR is a well-recognized in the field of childhood obesity research and communicates with other scholars, practitioners, and policy makers through the following channels:



SCHOLARLY JOURNALS

NCCOR members have published more than 60 peer-reviewed publications, including in the American Journal of Preventive Medicine, Childhood Obesity, and the Journal of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.



CONFERENCE ATTENDANCE

NCCOR projects are regularly featured at major academic and professional conferences, including the American Public HealthAssociations Annual meeting, ObesityWeek, and The International Society of Behavioral Nutrition and Physical Activity.



CONNECT & EXPLORE WEBINARS

NCCOR hosts regular webinars for the public on a range of topics related to childhood obesity.




NCCOR COMMUNICATION CHANNELS
