











# **NCCOR Strategic Planning Model**

#### **Turn Your Ideas Into Actions**

NCCOR members from different agencies come together to work on projects that are related to NCCOR's core mission and goals.



#### MEASUREMENT

Over the past 10 years, NCCOR has developed tools for program evaluation and childhood obesity research. NCCOR continues to define next steps in measurement needs



#### PHYSICAL ACTIVITY

NCCOR has several
workgroup projects focused
on research on the importance
of physical activity for
obesity prevention and overall
health in children, such as
the youth active travel
to school initiative.



#### DIET ASSESSMENT

NCCOR identifies gaps in diet research and develops research questions and methods of evaluation.



#### COVID-19

A workgroup was formed to understand the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and legislation on childcare systems, and further downstream, on child well-being.



# Work Within a Collaborative That Drives Results



#### **MEASURES REGISTRY**

A searchable database with more than 1,600 articles and 200 measures relevant to childhood obesity research (updated in 2021)

#### **MEASURES REGISTRY USER GUIDES**

Designed to complement the Measures Registry and provide an overview of measurement, describe general principles of measure selection, and share additional resources

#### **MEASURES REGISTRY LEARNING MODULES**

Consists of short, interactive videos to learn about the four domains of the Measures Registry (individual diet, food environment, individual physical activity, and physical activity environment) and quizzes to test your knowledge.

#### MEASURES FOR CHILDREN AT HIGH RISK FOR OBESITY DECISION TREE

Walks researchers and practitioners through a series of questions regarding whether to develop, adapt, or apply an instrument for obesity measures in high-risk populations







# **NCCOR Operations**

#### Member Meetings

- In-person, day-long interactive learning and planning sessions (held virtually during COVID-19)
- Feature expert speakers discussing emerging childhood obesity research and in-depth planning sessions
- Occur three times a year, typically in the winter, spring, and fall

#### Ad Hoc Projects & Workgroups

 Members from each project or workgroup decide how often to meet

#### Member Calls

- Virtual, 1-hour video conference with NCCOR program announcements and updates
- Feature NCCOR members and other expert speakers discussing current research, policies, and programs related to childhood obesity
- Occur monthly, except for months when a member meeting is scheduled

#### NCCOR External Scientific Panel (NESP)

 Serves as a liaison between NCCOR and the extramural community to inform NCCOR of new science and ideas



# The Pathway to NCCOR Projects



Share idea/opportunity with NCCOR

a. Present on a monthly call, at a Member Meeting, to the Steering Committee, or to the Coordinating Center



2 Interest among NCCOR partners

a. 2+ partner organizations agree




3 Complete Proposed Project Form

- Goal(s), lead and workgroup members, budget, timeline, communication products, evaluation
- b. Reviewed by Steering Committee representative before sharing with the full Steering Committee



4 Steering Committee reviews project for fit

- a. Is proposal consistent with NCCOR mission and goals?
- b. Does proposal address a critical research gap?
- c. Is there a clear benefit to identifying the project as an NCCOR project?
- d. Steering Committee provides feedback



#### 5 Determine funding resource(s) & mechanism(s)


- a. Funding from an NCCOR partner(s)
- b. Funding from the Coordinating Center
- c. Funding from a strategic alliance partner
- \*After funding opportunities have been examined, the Steering Committee will revisit project proposal and next steps.



# The Pathway to NCCOR Projects



- 6 Designate a lead person and set up a workgroup
- a. Workgroup has representation across NCCOR funders (as appropriate)
- b. Identify external scientific experts, if needed



- 7 Identify Coordinating Center support team
- a. Work with Coordinating Center to schedule workgroup meetings



Plan and conduct activities



- 9 Communicate results and findings
- a. Provide interim progress reports at member meetings and webinars



10 Evaluate outcome and impact
